Todos os passageiros que viajam para o Dubai devem preencher o [formulário de declaração sanitária](#) e o [formulário de realização de quarentena](#). Os formulários devem ser impressos, preenchidos e entregues aos funcionários da Autoridade de Saúde do Dubai à chegada.

EMIRATES | DUBAI IS OPEN TO TOURISTS ONCE AGAIN

Dear Agent,

Dubai is now open for tourists. There is no age restriction on travel.

Depending on your nationality you can get a visa on arrival, or you can apply for your visit visa from Dubai Immigration before you travel. [Find out if you need to get a visa here.](#)

You must have travel insurance with COVID-19 cover or declare at check-in that you will bear the costs for treatment and isolation if necessary before you travel. Bring an insurance certificate stating COVID-19 coverage to present at check-in.

Starting from 10 July, if you are flying with Emirates from the countries or airports specified below, you must carry a negative COVID-19 test certificate issued by a local government approved laboratory to be accepted on the flight. Where specified, a certificate from a UAE government designated laboratory in the country of origin is also acceptable. Certificates must be issued no more than 96 hours before departure:

- Afghanistan
- Bangladesh
- Egypt
- India
- Iran
- Nigeria
- Pakistan
- Philippines
- Russia
- Sudan
- Tanzania

USA - Dallas Fort Worth (DFW), Houston (IAH), Los Angeles (LAX), San Francisco (SFO), Fort Lauderdale (FLL) and Orlando (MCO), including passengers originating from California, Florida and Texas connecting to an Emirates flight to Dubai.

All other passengers must take a COVID-19 PCR test 96 hours before your flight and bring your negative COVID-19 test certificate with you when you travel. This also applies to children. A PCR test is also available on arrival in Dubai, if you haven't taken one in your home country (excluding travellers arriving from the countries above, who must have a negative test to be accepted on the flight).

If you take the PCR test on arrival in Dubai, you must self-isolate until you receive your test result.

If your test result is negative, you can leave your hotel and enjoy your trip as normal.

If the test result is positive, you must follow the advice of the Dubai Health Authority and stay in self-isolation.

All travellers to Dubai, including passengers with a connecting flight, must complete this health declaration form and give it to the staff at check-in. This form will also be available at check-in.

You will also need to complete the quarantine undertaking form given to you on board if Dubai is your final destination. Hand this form to the Dubai Health Authority staff on arrival.

Documents required when flying to Dubai

All travellers to Dubai, including passengers connecting in Dubai, need to fill in the [health declaration form](#) at check-in. You also need to complete the [quarantine undertaking form](#) given to you on board if Dubai is your final destination.
