LUFTHANSA | AS OF 13 MAY 2021: NEW REGULATIONS FOR TRAVELERS ENTERING OR TRANSITING IN GERMANY

What is new?

All passengers (all nationalities) from **all countries** (even "non-risk areas" and "risk areas") must hold a medical certificate (negative COVID test result, proof of vaccination or proof of immunity) to enter Germany when arriving from Non-risk, Risk- or High Incidence Areas (level 0-2).

<p>Medical Certificate must be in German, English, French, Spanish, Italian</p>	<p>All passengers (all nationalities) with final destination Germany must provide one of the following medical certificates (for transit through Germany see below):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> negative test result (digital or printed): Either PCR-/LAMP-/TMA-test not older than 72h (time of sampling), or AntiGen-test not older than 48h (time of sampling) before entry to Germany (= STA). Proof of immunity (digital or printed): positive PCR-/LAMP-/TMA-test, issued between 28 days and 6 months before entry Proof of vaccination (digital or printed): "completed vaccination", i.e. final dose has been given 14 days ago, the vaccine must be approved by Paul-Ehrlich-Institute (EMA) (https://www.pei.de/impfstoffe/covid-19) 			<p>Negative test result (digital or printed): Either PCR-/LAMP-/TMA-test not older than 72h (time of sampling), or AntiGen-test not older than 24h (time of sampling) before entry to Germany (=STA), even if holding additionally a proof immunity or vaccination.</p>
<p>Transfer within 24h</p>	<p>Children under the age of 6 are exempted.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Transfer from Schengen or Non-Schengen via Germany to Schengen destinations requires a valid medical certificate Transfer from Schengen via Germany to Non-Schengen destinations requires a valid medical certificate. Transfer from Non-Schengen via Germany to Non-Schengen destinations requires no medical certificate. <p>No DEA online registration is needed in any case.</p>			<p>From Schengen Origin: any transfer via Germany only allowed to German citizens and their immediate family members or holders of German resident permit. A medical certificate and DEA is required only for Schengen destinations.</p> <p>From Non-Schengen Origin: Transfer via Germany to German domestic flights & Schengen destinations is only allowed to German nationals and their immediate family members and holders of German resident permit. A medical certificate and DEA is required. Transfer via Germany to Non-Schengen is allowed to any national: [REDACTED]</p>
<p><i>Note:</i> Passengers must also comply with final destination entry requirements.</p>				

Following regulation remains unchanged regarding "areas of variant of concern:"

Only following PAX are allowed to enter Germany when their journey started in "areas of variant of concern" (level 3):

- German nationals and their immediate family members*. Immediate family members must travel together with the respective German national
- holders of German resident permit. Immediate family members of holders of German resident permit are **not** allowed to enter Germany

*definition of "immediate family members": next of kin (i.e. parents and children), spouse, common-law partner
