LUFTHANSA | PASSAGEIROS QUE ENTRAM (OU TRANSITAM) NA ALEMANHA [ATUALIZAÇÃO 17/MAIO]

Estimados Parceiros

Recordo que o embarque em voos para a Alemanha (como destino final ou transito) deve sempre ter em conta qual a “classificação de risco” atribuída pelo Robert Koch Institut (www.rki.de/risikogebirte) e é esta classificação que vai determinar os correspondentes critérios de entrada (ou transito).

Depois da comunicação da passada sexta-feira, foram novamente alterados alguns desses critérios. Assim, mantiveram-se as regras para os passageiros com destino final na Alemanha, (comunicadas na mensagem anterior) **mas foram definidos novos critérios para os passageiros em “transito” na Alemanha (a amarelo):**

LUFTHANSA | PASSENGERS ENTERING (OR TRANSITING) GERMANY [UPDATED 17/MAY]

Dear Partners

I remind you that boarding flights to Germany (as final destination or transit) must always take into account the "risk classification" assigned by the Robert Koch Institut (www.rki.de/risikogebirte) and it is this classification that will determine the corresponding entry (or transit) criteria.

After last Friday's communication, some of these criteria have been changed again. Thus, the rules have been maintained for passengers with final destination in Germany, (communicated in the previous message), **but new criteria were defined for passengers in transit in Germany (in yellow):**
